




Catechesis


11-Year Baptism vs Funeral Summary





This past year, we experienced a remarkable resurgence in sacramental life, celebrating **more baptisms** than we have in many years—our highest number since before the pandemic. Evangelization

"We use the word **evangelization** because its root meaning is 'Gospel' (Good News) and because it calls us, even if it is uncomfortable, to live the faith of our baptism more openly and to share it more freely." (CCC 24)

This year was a powerful testament to what happens when faith becomes action. As a parish, we deepened our commitment to evangelization and answering Christ's call to serve and share His love.

This year, our parish lived out its mission in powerful ways. We hosted 12 more **ministry fundraisers** than last year, creating opportunities for fellowship and strengthening the work of our ministries. Our **liturgical team** grew by 11 new volunteers, enriching the beauty and reverence of our worship.

We also brought back the **9 AM livestream**, connecting homebound parishioners and those afar to the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. And through **Little Light Ministry**, we expanded outreach to Delaware's First Friday events, with different ministries hosting a St. Mary table each month—shining Christ's light beyond our church walls.

Every milestone reflects our shared call: to know Christ, love Christ, and bring others to Christ.



We've seen a joyful rise in weddings at St. Mary since our renovations began. It's a blessing to walk with couples as they embrace the Sacrament of Marriage! This year, we launched a mentorship couple program, pairing married parishioners with the engaged to offer guidance, prayer, and support as they prepare for this sacred commitment.

Growing in Faith and Fellowship

Our parish is alive and growing! From October to May, **Sunday Mass attendance increased by 166 people**, a beautiful sign of renewed engagement. Our Hallowed Hayride returned with pre-COVID numbers, drawing 150–200 attendees, and Parish Council launched **Donut Fellowship Sundays** to strengthen community and hospitality.



Serving the Hungry and Needy

We hosted **4 food drives**, collecting and donating **over 4,916 pounds of food** to support families experiencing hunger. Through **15 meal trains** for parish families with newborns or recovering from surgery, we provided an average of eight meals per family—a total of 120 meals shared in love and care.

Our outreach extended to the homeless, where parishioners made **over 400 sandwiches** for distribution on New Year's Day. Additionally, **14 parishioners joined Family Promise**, dedicating time and energy to feed and support those experiencing homelessness. Each act of service, whether big or small, reflects our parish's heart for mercy and our shared mission to bring Christ's love to those who hunger and thirst for justice, compassion, and hope.








THIS YEAR: we saw our **lowest expenses** in recent history—even lower than during COVID—and our **highest offertory** in over seven years.




TOTAL EXPENSES & INCOME

TOTAL OFFERTORY INCOME




2024-2025 Offertory Increase Goal
